1. Meeting opened 13:00
2. Peter 3AXI welcomed all attendees
3. Guests: Peter Glasson (new Foundation) and Scott (new member)
4. Apologies. 3KFM, 3AFD, 3EB, 3NQS, Jacek, 3KBY, Josh and Colin.

Reports

5. Treasurers report. The Financial report for year end was presented. Noted was the great success of the Bunnings BBQ held between Christmas and New Year with a great profit.

Proposed Peter 3ASK seconded Ian 3YYY. Carried

6. Technical report:

Ray 3YNV reported that IRL is down and was removed to change the PCU. The earthing upgrades made are also working well.

AllStar is being setup on a 70cm node. The repeater operations will be enhanced with Echolink and will also be accessible by those with AllStar nodes. Colin has offered to assist with the AllStar node.

5. Technical report. The Technical report at the general meeting was accepted for this meeting (same day).
6. Newsletter. The Newsletter report at the general meeting was accepted for this meeting (same day).
7. Website. The website is working well with 24 members now registered for access to the site.
8. Membership. A great discussion was had around growing our membership. Ray indicated that 100+ people per week (outside the club) have been applying for access to the website. We noted this as a great reference that the website is really working and is providing potential members. This led to a discussion around a possible Associate membership status that could accommodate the website access and as an entry to full membership. It was noted by several of our members of their

membership of associated amateur activity around the world and the success of such engagements. This could provide valuable revenue to the club but would require work to the website to accommodate a payment service (PayPal?) to support new member categories such as 'forum only'. To assist in 'filtering' access a suggestion was to verify and limit to licenced amateurs. A suggested fee structure was \$10. The next step is for the committee to discuss this further to provide a way ahead.

9. The subject of meetings and what occurs at each meeting. Currently we have our 10am start and a full meeting with all members after the lunch. This meeting is predominantly activities that are managed by the Committee and as a courtesy all members are invited to attend. As this has always been extended so that all can have a say and get involved when voting happens all are asked to vote. It was noted that many members felt the direction inclusive of the meeting was too long and the discussions around shortening or separating into 'club' and 'committee' sections of the day to allow members to decide if they stay on or not. It was noted that a person does not have to stay and there is no compulsion to stay if they want. However, the structure of this still requires some further discussion as to providing other meeting elements that suit the various activities inside the club (i.e. Technical team, relevant discussions etc). A vote was had at this point as to changing to suit changing the timing and structure.

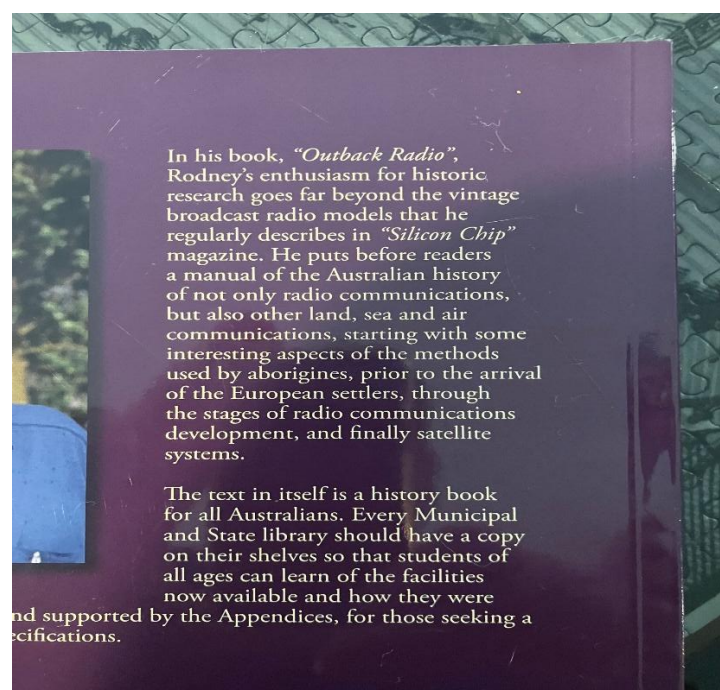
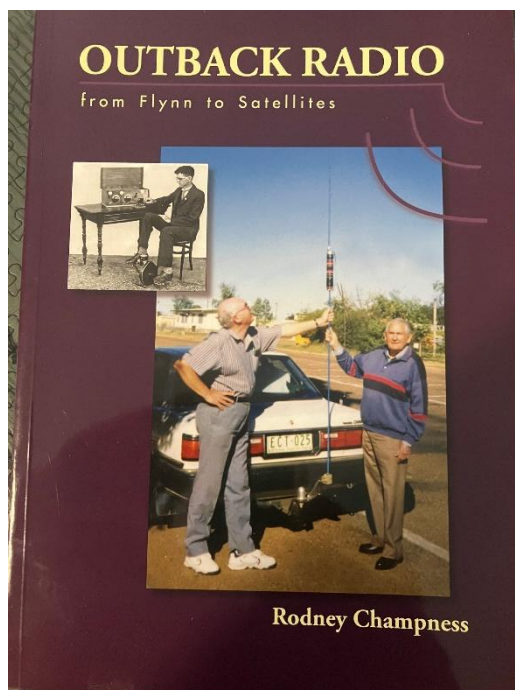
Outback Radio Book by Rodney Champness. For sale \$10.00

Outback Radio is a 186 page A4 size book complete with a total of 92 diagrams, pictures and circuits. Up until now there has been no book published which has traced the history of the development of communications (particularly radio communications) in outback Australia. The book shows the social, educational, medical and business uses to which radio communications have been put to in the outback. The story describes how the equipment came to be developed by Traeger and others to meet the impossible technical requirements of the 1920s. Radio was in its infancy at that time. The progressive improvements in radio equipment design and capabilities are explored through the book and end up with the use of satellite phone communications.
